



St Anne's and Guardian Angels Pupil Premium Spend and Outcomes 2019-2020

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is a grant which amounts to £1,320 per pupil that schools receive to support pupils who are eligible for free school meals which research shows are more likely to underachieve. The grant is provided in order to support these pupils to maximise their learning potential.

School Context

St Anne's is a larger than average Catholic Primary School with capacity for 50 children in each year group. The proportion of boys to girls is similar to schools nationally. Approximately 33% of the pupils are White British with the remainder coming from a huge variety of ethnic backgrounds the largest of which is Brazilian. Over a third of pupils have English as a second language.

Approximately 39% of the pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding; the school is in the highest deprivation indicator nationally. The proportion of pupils with learning difficulties and/or disabilities is above average, 8 pupils have EHC plans and 29% are on the SEN register. Many pupils have behavioural, emotional and social difficulties and we have a high number of pupils on our Child Protection register.

A number of pupils join and leave the school outside normal times. Our Pupil Premium Policy states that: *"the Governors recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for Pupil Premium. The Governors reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately recognised as being socially disadvantaged."*

How much did the school receive?

In 2019-2020 the school received **£156,000**; this equates to **118** children eligible for Free School Meals. In **April 2020** there were **233** pupils on roll, **106** girls and **127** boys. *At the end of the financial year 2021 the school expects to have received £146,204.00; this equates to 111 pupils or 48% of the pupils that are eligible for Free School Meals.*
